A Message from Ken Loving MD, Chief Executive Officer



At Access Community Health Centers, our work would not be possible without the support of people like you, who support our work generously; our community partners, who sustain us and help us grow; each of our more than 300 staff members; and the more than 32,000 people who call Access their health care home.

This Annual Report tells the story of a community that recognizes the significant need for our services and provides extraordinary support to ensure that people

get the health care they need, regardless of the challenges they may face or their ability to pay.

With your support, in the past year we have cared for more people than ever before:

- We provided more than 165,000 medical, dental and behavioral health visits at our five area clinics.
- Our Celebrate Smiles mobile dental program provided essential dental care to more than 3,100 children at 50 schools in the Madison and Sun Prairie school districts.
- As a member of the Dane County Health Council, we collaborated with community partners to improve the health outcomes of Black infants in our community.
- We expanded our substance use disorder treatment options and care management services to meet the increasing demand for behavioral health care among our patients and in our community.

All of this, and more, is made possible through the support of individuals, businesses, foundations and the health care community. Your commitment helps us put the pieces in place so together we can make a more profound impact on the health of the people we serve.

With this support, we continue to grow and invest in our work to care for more people who need us.

Our plan over the next five years is to leverage our success to expand our clinics, develop our workforce and deepen our partnerships. As that occurs, more adults are prepared to achieve in the workforce and care for their families and more children in our community are healthy and ready to learn.

This year, we focused our Annual Report on the significant work we do every day for the 12,617 children we care for. They represent more than 38 percent of our patient population at Access. We provide a range of services to meet their needs including well child checks, immunizations, behavioral and mental health care and comprehensive dental services.

We offer children and their families a familiar and welcoming environment and the ability to receive care in a language that is their own. At Access, no patient under the age of 20 without insurance is billed for the care and services they receive. This guarantees that no family faces a financial barrier to their children receiving care.

We are proud to provide such important care to children as they grow. We know a healthier childhood leads to better outcomes in school and greater opportunities for children to pursue their dreams and live the life they choose.

Please help us grow to do more for our community and thank you for all you have done to help us make a real difference in the lives of the people we serve.

The Way We Work

Access Community Health Centers is a non-profit organization with the mission of improving the health and lives of individuals and families who otherwise face financial, cultural or language barriers that prevent access to high-quality, affordable health care.

For more than 40 years, Access has done just that. We have grown and adapted to meet the needs of our rapidly changing community and now offer care to more than 32,000 individuals throughout southwest Wisconsin at five locations in Madison, Sun Prairie and Dodgeville.

As a community health center, we have a unique ability to provide care to those who need it in a safe and culturally appropriate environment. Some examples include:

- Patients can receive an array of services in one clinic location, providing an efficient way to get healthy and stay healthy.
- We offer medical, dental and behavioral health care in addition to community resource and financial counseling and affordable medications.
- Care at Access addresses the causes of poor health and helps to prevent illness through immunizations and education, low-cost medications and more.
- Through our in-house translation team, patients receive care in their primary language.
- We offer care regardless of a patient's insurance coverage or ability to pay.
- People most in need can receive services through a sliding scale discount.

By working to remove the many challenges that patients face, Access provides care and support that make a significant impact in a patient's life and offer hope and opportunity. Our committed and talented staff provide our patients with an open and affirming place where they feel comfortable discussing matters regarding their health.

A major part of our work is to strive for greater equity in health care. We understand that we can only make real change if we work with the communities affected and our health care partners.

We strengthen the impact we have in our community through the support of our Board of Directors, our Patient Advisory Councils and our Community Advisory Council. We collaborate with individuals and organizations throughout the community to do more and to bring more to people in need.

This shared mission among so many people demonstrates the good that can be done when we work together with a common goal.

Focus on Kids

One of the most important parts of our work at Access is caring for children throughout their formative years. In this year's Annual Report, we are focusing on our work with children and their families.

Access to health care is essential to the development of every child. At Access, 38 percent of our patients are under 18. Our health care teams see them often throughout childhood and provide medical, dental and behavioral health care as they grow.

Regular health checkups for children are important to gauge development and promote early interventions when needed. Tending to a child's health is more than just tracking their height and weight. It also includes making sure they have proper nutrition, enough physical activity, restful sleep, timely immunizations, access to behavioral health care and strong dental care.

Access has a unique ability to provide this care and more to children and families.

Our goal is to provide a warm and welcoming environment that removes any barriers children and their families may experience. As part of their care, families have access to a variety of programs to help them with any barriers they may be experiencing and to ensure their children are healthy and strong.

We know consistent and high-quality health care can influence a child's physical and emotional health, growth and development and their capacity to reach their full potential. When children fail to receive necessary health care, their lives and the lives of their families can be affected for many years.

Work still needs to be done to support children and families throughout our community. With your help, we can ensure that children have the care they need to reach their full potential, be healthy and live the life they choose.

FOCUS ON KIDS Our Celebrate Smiles program provides preventive and restorative dental care at schools in Madison and Sun Prairie. In 2023, more than 3,100 children received care in school or in our mobile dental unit – the Celebrate Smiles Care Mobile. Over the past five years, nearly 10,000 children have received care.



Financial Overview

As the health care environment becomes increasingly complex, this last year has been one of both opportunity and challenge for Access. We have made significant investments to ensure that the people with the greatest need and the fewest resources are able to get the high-quality, affordable health care they need, providing a consistent health care home to the most vulnerable people in our community.

Helping Patients Stay Covered

Since the pandemic ended, BadgerCare eligibility rules have returned to their pre-COVID structure. This means fewer patients are now eligible for BadgerCare and for those who are still eligible, they must now renew annually. This process has been a challenge for thousands of our patients.

This year, Access has made significant investments to ensure that patients have the information and help they need.

- Our Patient Services team reached out to thousands of patients and helped more than 2,000 patients complete BadgerCare applications.
- We collaborate with Dane County through a contracted position to review applications and assist patients with questions.
- We employ two family health liaisons with the Madison Metropolitan School District to screen and enroll children and their families in BadgerCare.
- We work closely with our health insurance partners to help identify and enroll patients.

Access' status as a Federally Qualified Health Center means that we are reimbursed for this work, which allows us to direct grants and donations to patient care. For patients who are no longer eligible for BadgerCare and become uninsured, Access continues to serve as their health care home.

Making Care Accessible

Access continues to make our services affordable. Patients under the age of 20 continue to receive care and medications free-of-charge.

Access offers a Sliding Fee Discount program to help uninsured, underinsured, or low-income individuals and families pay for health care. The program uses a sliding fee scale based on the patient's income and family size to adjust the amount they owe for services.

Offering Affordable Medications

Access is eligible for the 340B Drug Pricing Program, a federal program that allows us to purchase outpatient medications at significantly reduced costs. We can then pass the savings on to patients through reduced drug prices and invest additional savings to expand access to care for others in our community.

Despite increasing pressure from pharmaceutical companies to significantly reduce the program, Access is committed to consistently providing our patients with the prescriptions that they need at an affordable price. Access saved uninsured patients and patients on our Sliding Scale Discount more than \$6 million on their prescriptions in Fiscal Year 2024.

Providing the Best Care

This year, we have also invested in our staff, ensuring a livable wage, competitive benefits and a workplace environment that reflects our mission and values. Over the past year, we have hired six new dentists and five new medical providers. Our retention rate of approximately 90 percent shows that staff want to stay at Access and are committed to providing excellent care for our patients.

Our successful navigation of the challenges of the pandemic, strong recruitment and exceptional employee retention rate will allow us to provide care for more patients and ensure adequate reimbursement. We pay close attention to the sustainability of our work and we remain incredibly grateful to the patients, staff, donors and community that make it possible.

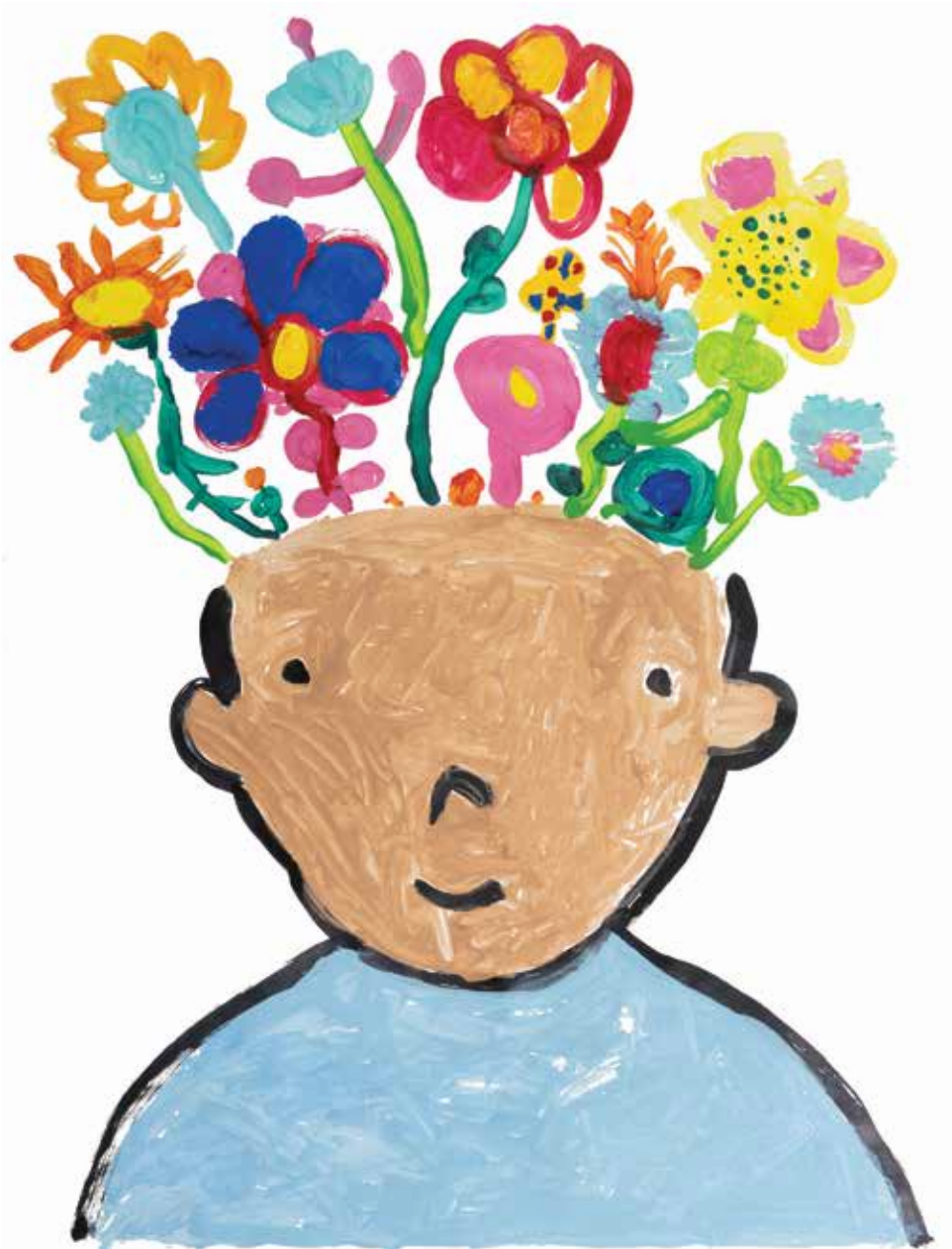
